## President's Report

The year 2008 was a difficult and challenging one for the Box Hill Hawks Football Club. Under the circumstances, the fact that the Club was able to improve on its 2007 on-field performance, maintain a stable financial position and significantly advance its plans to redevelop Box Hill City Oval represented overall a satisfactory result.

Entering 2008 under a new and proven Senior Coach, Barry Mitchell, and with an improved V.F.L. player list, the Club had expectations of a first Finals appearance since 2005. A moderately successful recruiting campaign enticed Steve Kenna and Alister Neville back to the Club and reaped several new recruits including Nathan Batsanis and Digby Morrell. On the down side was the departure of 2007 Club Champion, Nick Smith, and dual Club Champion, Matthew Ball.

The season commenced disastrously with the Seniors losing the first nine matches. For much of the time the team was competitive but an abnormally high number of injuries and suspensions amongst Hawthorn's list severely tested the depth of the Box Hill Hawks list and we were found wanting. The low point came on the Queen's Birthday holiday when we were defeated by the Bendigo Bombers at home; the Box Hill team contained just seven A.F.L. listed players with a combined total of 18 A.F.L. games of experience. There is a mantra in V.F.L. circles that an aligned Club is only as good as its V.F.L. list, to an extent this is true, but no Club could have performed at its best under the circumstances that the Box Hill Hawks encountered during the first half of 2008.

After the ninth successive loss against Bendigo, the season could have gone either of two directions. The players and coaches could have lost heart totally and we could have gone through the season with very few wins indeed. To the great credit of all involved, the players regrouped and 6 of the final 11 matches were won; 4 of those victories against teams that eventually played in the Finals. In the final weeks of the season, with a good complement of A.F.L. listed players blending with a number of strong performers on the V.F.L. list, I believe we were playing a standard of Football worthy of a Finalist. Thrashings were handed out to the bottom two placed teams, the Bendigo Bombers and Tasmania, which reinforced the Box Hill Hawks' undoubted improvement.

Our Reserves team similarly stepped up a gear in the second half of the season, culminating in a second Grand Final appearance in three years. At the half way point of the season, the Coburg Tigers and Williamstown were clearly the dominant Reserve Grade teams and seemed certain to play off in the Grand Final. The Box Hill Hawks was one of about six teams battling for the other three Finals positions. Towards the end of the season, the improvement in a number of our younger players became apparent and our Reserves started to play a very strong brand of Football. In the final home and away game we defeated Williamstown to claim the double chance and in the Preliminary Final we eliminated the Coburg Tigers, who had gone through the home and away round undefeated, from the Premiership race. Unfortunately our players couldn't repeat the heroics of the Reserves 2006 Premiership; the Grand Final was in the balance for 3-½ quarters, but Williamstown, with the benefit of a week's rest, was able to steady in the final 15 minutes and emerge a clear victor.

I believe that the Box Hill Hawks has now rebuilt a solid Football base and is in a position to challenge for a Finals berth in 2009. This is dependant on the Club being able to consolidate the undoubted gains that it achieved in the second half of the 2008 season, something we have failed to accomplish in the past three or four years.

I congratulate all our trophy winners in 2008, particularly our Club Champion, Steve Kenna, who we were delighted to welcome back to the Box Hill Hawks after four seasons playing in the A.F.L. and the S.A.N.F.L. He clearly showed that he is an elite player at this level and was a shining light during the early rounds of the season when the team struggled.

Whatever were the Club's problems during the first half of 2008, the ability of our Senior Coach to get the best out of the playing group was not one of those. Barry Mitchell is an outstanding coach who, by the end of the season, achieved an improved performance from the Box Hill Hawks despite trying circumstances. Barry expressed his burning desire to return to coaching in the A.F.L. to the Club when he accepted our coaching appointment. We were therefore disappointed but not surprised when he informed us at the end of the 2008 season that he had accepted an assistant coach's position with the Fremantle Football Club. We wish Barry well and thank him for his efforts with the Box Hill Hawks this year.

Barry Mitchell's departure left the Box Hill Hawks in the invidious position of looking for a new Senior Coach for the fifth time in seven seasons. I believe that the lack of stability in our coaching structure has been one of the significant contributing factors to our decline in on-field performance since 2004. We therefore took a different approach to the selection of our next Senior Coach and deliberately sought an outstanding young coach from outside the A.F.L. system who would see a three or four year period in the V.F.L. as an essential part of his career progression. For this reason I see the appointment of Brendon Bolton, previously an assistant coach with the Tasmania Devils, as an exciting one for the Club. At 29 years of age, I believe he is the youngest Senior Coach of this Club since 1975, when our great champion Geoff Bryant was Captain-Coach of Box Hill at the age of 28. Brendon is extremely well credentialed to coach in the V.F.L. and during the interview process his passion and desire to coach at this level was apparent, which was not displayed by other quality candidates who had already coached in the A.F.L. system. In many ways Brendon Bolton's appointment will be seen as a bold or even experimental one, but I believe that he is the right man to lead this Club into a new and successful era.

Off the field, the Club experienced significant challenges on a number of fronts. After five consecutive operating profits, a trading loss of some \$9,328 was recorded. The two major factors affecting the result were a shortfall in sponsorship and fundraising and a significant overspend on match payments, due to the lowest number of Hawthorn listed players representing the Box Hill Hawks since the alignment commenced and the participation of the Reserves team in four Finals matches. While our 2008 trading result was far from disastrous, the Club faces a number of real challenges moving into 2009. Our cash position has never been better but much of this has already been earmarked for the fit-out of the new South Pavilion. Traditional revenue streams such as sponsorship and fundraising will come under great pressure in what is likely to be an environment of a rapidly deteriorating economy. In addition, the Club is not quite half way to raising the \$250,000 it has pledged to contribute towards the construction of the new South Pavilion at Box Hill City Oval.

Undoubtedly the most significant off-field event during the year was that construction of the new South Pavilion at City Oval commenced on 10<sup>th</sup> November 2008. Much progress of our Club's plans to redevelop our home ground was accomplished during the year. In May, Sports and Recreation Victoria announced that Box Hill City Oval would receive \$600,000 as part of a \$10 million funding package for the redevelopment of all V.F.L. venues. This meant that a total of \$1.95 million from six stakeholders (City of Whitehorse, Sports and Recreation Victoria, A.F.L. Victoria, the Hawthorn Football Club, the Box Hill Hawks Football Club and the Box Hill Cricket Club) was confirmed for the construction of the new South Pavilion and further improvements at City Oval, effectively making the project fully funded.



In August, the Box Hill Hawks Football Club and Whitehorse Council agreed rent terms for the Club to occupy the new South Pavilion on a long term basis. Finally, on 20<sup>th</sup> October 2008, Council appointed the builder for the new South Pavilion, the culmination of 4-½ years of patient perseverance by our Club. The building is scheduled to be completed in mid-May 2009 and we have already earmarked our home game against Sandringham on Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> June 2009 for the official opening. I believe that the forthcoming years will demonstrate how important this facility will be for our Club. With a total floor area of 500 square metres, two independent function rooms and a full commercial kitchen, the potential of this new facility is almost limitless.

I thank all stakeholders who have worked with our Club for so long to enable the construction of this new pavilion to commence. We have received magnificent practical and financial support from the Hawthorn Football Club and A.F.L. Victoria to achieve this outcome. We gratefully acknowledge the support of Whitehorse Council, which shares our vision to turn Box Hill City Oval into a showpiece of the V.F.L. competition. On a sombre note, it is with great sadness that I note the sudden passing of Cr. Bill Bowie during the year. Bill was a true supporter of active support as well as many other community causes within the municipality and would have taken great pride in seeing this project completed.

The V.F.L. competition itself faces a number of challenges moving forwards. Tasmania's withdrawal means that the bye will be reintroduced into the Seniors fixture next year which is far from ideal. The presence of two A.F.L. Reserves teams in the competition in 2008 undoubtedly caused an even greater structural disconnect between the V.F.L. Seniors and Reserves competitions. The ramifications from the A.F.L.'s Second Tier Review delivered at the end of the 2007 season, which recommended full integration between the V.F.L. and T.A.C. Cup Clubs, remain unclear. Twelve months down the track the only tangible changes seem to be minor amendments to the T.A.C. Cup recruiting zone boundaries. If there is apathy or even resistance to the proposed changes at V.F.L. and T.A.C. Cup Club level, I believe that it is because thus far no compelling case has been developed showing that integration of the competitions will produce better talent development and financial outcomes.

Of great concern to A.F.L. Victoria must be that the V.F.L. competition is developing into one of the gaming "haves" versus the gaming "have nots". A decade after the V.F.L. was restructured; the evidence is that the gulf that existed between the ability and fitness of A.F.L. and V.F.L. listed players has greatly diminished. Having an alignment with an A.F.L. Club is no longer a guarantee of success. Financial capacity now seems to be the main criteria. It is no mere coincidence that in 2008 the dominant three Clubs were the three with significant gaming income. Just a few weeks ago, A.F.L. Victoria presented the V.F.L. Club Presidents with figures that showed, on average, Clubs with gaming have \$200,000 greater annual revenues than Clubs without gaming. Of the eleven Victorian based V.F.L. Clubs (excluding the two A.F.L. Reserves teams), seven reported paying less than seventy percent of the V.F.L. Salary Cap. These figures are not healthy and must be very concerning for the long term viability of the V.F.L. competition unless true equalisation can be achieved.

At the Box Hill Hawks we are very fortunate to have a strong alignment with the Hawthorn Football Club which has recognised these issues and significantly increased its financial support in recent years. But the challenge is there for our Club to grow our revenue base to ensure our long term viability. I record my appreciation for Hawthorn's support of this Club at all levels. With the dissolution of the Sandringham and Melbourne partnership at the end of the 2008 season, next year the Box Hill Hawks and Hawthorn alignment becomes the first to enter a tenth season. This would not have happened without the efforts of all involved – from both sides of the partnership – who have worked together at all times to make the alignment work.

Of course the Hawthorn Football Club claimed a famous victory in 2008, defeating the hot favourites Geelong in the Grand Final to claim it's tenth V.F.L./A.F.L. Premiership. To all involved at Hawthorn, I extend my sincere congratulations. At the Box Hill Hawks it has been an interesting experience to observe at close quarters how Hawthorn has gone about rebuilding its fortunes after the low point of 2004. It now sets a standard of off-field professionalism and on-field performance that is second to none and something that we aim to emulate at the Box Hill Hawks in our own much smaller way. It was interesting to note that seven of Hawthorn's Premiership team played in either or both Box Hill's 2001 and 2003 V.F.L. Grand Final appearances, so we can truly claim to have played our own small part in this A.F.L. Premiership triumph. Not to mention that the team was captained by a Box Hill draftee, our own Sam Mitchell.

To the businesses that generously support the Box Hill Hawks Football Club, I again express our sincere gratitude. We are fortunate to a number of long-term sponsors who are both generous and enthusiastic about their involvement with this Club. In particular I acknowledge our Major Sponsor, Budget Car and Truck Rental. A full listing of all those businesses and organisations that support our Club is on the inside front cover of this Annual Report.

I thank my fellow Box Hill Hawks Directors for their efforts and contribution towards the smooth operation of the Club. It is with heartfelt gratitude that I acknowledge the magnificent contributions of Rob Collier and Mark Lisle. Both are stepping down as Directors at the end of 2008 after a combined total of 37 years of service to the Club. Rob Collier has served as a Club Director since 1991 including a stint as President from 1997 to 1999 when his steady leadership meant a great deal to the Club during a period of tumult and upheaval for the V.F.L., culminating in the competition restructuring in 2000. Mark Lisle has served the Club continuously since 1990. Although one or two may come close, no one has surpassed Mark's contribution to the Box Hill Football Club as both a champion player and administrator. Mark is young enough that we can hope that he may once again become actively involved with the Box Hill Hawks. In the meantime, by happy circumstance, Mark and Shelley's eldest son has been drafted by Hawthorn. We can look forward to the prospect of Jordan Lisle gracing City Oval for a period while he hones his skills for A.F.L. Football. It makes me feel old to say that I have been around the Club for long enough to remember when Mark used to carry Jordan around in his arms.

To Andrew Pirchan and Bob Lyford, both having completed their seventh year of employment with the Box Hill Hawks Football Club, thank you once again for all your hard work and professionalism. It has not been the easiest of years for our administration but we end the year in good shape to face the undoubted significant challenges that will confront us in 2009.

To our support staff and volunteers, thank you once again for your efforts. This Club would not be able to function without you. Each and every one of you does your part to make the Box Hill Hawks Football Club the professional State League Club that it is today. I am delighted to announce that three long serving Club officials; Gordon McCrimmon, Alan McDonald and Glen Thorley have been honoured in 2008 with life membership of the Club. It is also pleasing to note that the Hawthorn Football Club has recognised two of its loyal volunteers, Karen Lowrey and Tina Wilson, with Service Awards. Both Karen and Tina have assisted the Box Hill Hawks on home match days for several years and their service to the Box Hill Hawks was taken into account in their well deserved Service Awards.

Finally, I thank the Box Hill Hawks Football Club's Members and Directors for once again granting me the honour of being President of this great Club. After six years I am unsure as to how much longer I should serve as President and I believe that it is in the Club's interests that a succession plan of sorts is developed. However, you have my assurance that for however long I have the privilege of filling this role, I shall give it 100%. To all, my best wishes for a very Merry Christmas and a happy and prosperous New Year in 2009.

## Community Partnerships

In 2007 the Box Hill Hawks Football Club embarked on a new and exciting programme, extending its involvement within the local community by aligning itself with specific not-for-profit organisations and forming Community Partnerships.

A review of our previous community involvement identified that the Club had supported and participated in numerous community based charity events for many years. However, our approach in the past was completely ad-hoc, driven by various requests at hand and, as such, focused outcomes were not achieved and there was little broader knowledge or recognition of our community participation.

The purpose of the Club aligning with key charities was so that we could be pro-active rather than reactive in developing meaningful community partnerships. Instead of spreading our wings far and wide throughout the community and therefore diluting our efforts, we could focus on a smaller number programmes developed in conjunction with selected Community Partners, therefore achieving far better results.

The main criteria in selecting these organisations were that they were locally based and that their activities and involvement within the community did not conflict with one another. The Box Hill Hawks Football Club's Community Partners during 2008 were the Whitehorse Community Chest, Epworth Eastern Hospital, Reach Out For Kids and Life Education.

All in all, the Box Hill Hawks Football Club is delighted with the success of its Community Partnerships programme over the past two seasons and looks forward to increasing its involvement with these groups in the coming years.

An overview of the activities undertaken with our Community Partners during 2008 is as follows:

### Life Education

Life Education aims to empower young people to make safe and informed decisions about drugs and their health. Facilitated by specialist educators, who use innovative and interactive teaching strategies, Life Education develops young people's life skills, knowledge and confidence.

Reaching approximately 200,000 children and 18,000 families each year through family and school-based programs, Life Education is the largest independent, not-for-profit drug education organisation in Australia.
