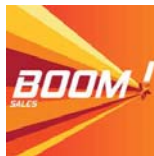

Football Operations Report

In 2022 we were thankfully able to complete a full V.F.L. season and the V.F.L. side did a great job in making the Finals but unfortunately fell short in the Elimination Final against the Gold Coast Suns at Metricon Stadium. Although we exited the Finals in the first week, we can look back on the season very proud of the effort from our coaches, staff and players.

So far in 2022 we've had another two players drafted from Box Hill to Hawthorn. It's been a highly successful few years on that front with James Blanck and Fergus Greene elevated to the A.F.L. list this year alone.

James entered his third year with Box Hill and really stood out across pre-season and in the early rounds. The tall defender arrived from the Eastern Ranges at the end of 2020 and after two interrupted seasons notably fronted up to the 2022 pre-season having done plenty of work physically to prepare him for a breakout V.F.L. year. It certainly paid off and he quickly became very capable at V.F.L. level gaining interest from various A.F.L. Clubs. In the end we're glad he landed at Hawthorn via the mid-season draft.

Fergus arrived at Box Hill in 2021 after being delisted by the Western Bulldogs. He performed strongly in the interrupted 2021 season as a forward and continued in 2022 kicking over 50 goals to stamp himself as the best V.F.L. listed forward in the competition. He has been added to Hawthorn's A.F.L. list as a delisted free agent which is pleasing to see him stay in brown and gold.

Both these stories speak volumes for the Box Hill Football program and the development that is priority for our coaches and staff. The recent additions of Jai Newcombe, Lachlan Bramble, James Blanck and Fergus Greene from Box Hill to Hawthorn has really taken the alignment to another level.

As is also tradition at Box Hill, many staff were able to gain employment at the elite level via their experience at our Club including a host of staff that joined Hawthorn's inaugural A.F.L.W. program including David Mackay (Coach), Keegan Brooksby (Coach), Laura McDonald (Doctor), Alex Stone (Dietician), Michael Allen (Analyst) and Nicole Tumblety (Sports Science). It's been another fantastic year of results regarding the progression of our people on and off the field and it is something all associated with the Club should be proud of.

These achievements would not be possible without the support of our Board of Directors lead by President Ed Sill and Vice Presidents David Schwarz and Carli Barnes. I'd personally like to thank them all for their on-going support of the Club, Football program and staff individually.

Thank you to Harry Rooke (Football Operations) for your tireless work across the year forever supporting the coaches and players to enable them to perform at their best. In 2022 we welcomed Clint Proctor into the Senior Coaching role after he spent 2021 as an Assistant Coach to Sam Mitchell at Box Hill. The position in 2022 was a part-time role and Clint did an amazing job under those circumstances to build strong relationships across both Hawthorn and Box Hill and get the best out of all our people.

The position of Senior Coach in 2023 is moving full time back within Hawthorn's Football Department, but I'd like to congratulate Clint on taking Box Hill to a Finals series and having two players drafted under his watch. I'd like to extend a thank you to our many coaches including Andy Otten, Andy Collins, Peter Schwab, Cam Howat, Clinton Young, David Mackay, Stephen Greene, Michael Allen and Kristan Height. As an extension to this group, we're so well supported in our Academy program lead by David Banfield, Jason Philactides and Kade Pargeter and the work they have again done through our *Spread Your Wings* program and across our pathways with Eastern Ranges and Gippsland Power is outstanding.

Thank you to Dylan Vizzarri for leading the high-performance program again in 2022. Dylan continues to grow in the role and we know it's a matter of time before he gets his opportunity at the elite level. He was well supported by staff including Laura McDonald, James Serong, Charlie Logan, Rama Davies, Nicole Tumblety, Che Bonini, Alex Stone and Mary Spillane.

To Cherie O'Neill, our V.F.L.W. Coach, congratulations on arguably the most successful season I believe we'll ever experience at this level. V.F.L. Report

If 2020 was the season that wasn't, and 2021 was the season that wasn't finished – it serves to reason that 2022 was the season hellbent on making up for lost time.

On and off-field, the club rode a rollercoaster of euphoria and hardship – galvanised by both to become a team in the truest sense of the word. The after-the-siren home win against Port Melbourne, punctuated by late heroics from Ben Cavarra and Fergus Greene, will live long in the memory. So too will the Round 3 win at the MCG against Sandringham, the Club's first visit to the venue since 2019 and its first win of the new season. How about Round 8 against Richmond? On a blustery day at City Oval, Box Hill Senior Coach Clint Proctor made the bold call to kick into a stiff breeze. Behind all afternoon, the Hawks expertly read the conditions and timed their run perfectly to rattle home 33-point winners with an eight-goal final quarter.

The Round 10 trip to the Gold Coast, the Club's first interstate jaunt in 12 years, was marked by a special win in extra special threads; Box Hill's first-ever Indigenous Guernsey, designed by Corree Thorpe, cousin of ruck-forward Jaylon.

What's old was new again as we donned a special 'Mustangs' kit to honour the launch of Box Hill Football Club's Hall of Fame and its twenty-one inaugural inductees in the Round 17 win over Werribee.

James Blanck completed his journey from Park Orchards to the prime-time, with the developing defender the latest in a long line of Box Hill products to win a place on Hawthorn's senior list.

On an individual front, Cal Porter's outstanding season was recognised on Col Austen Trophy night, with the hard-nosed midfielder taking out top honours from Ben Cavarra in second place and the evergreen Damian Mascitti in third. Greene and Cavarra were each selected in the V.F.L.'s Team of the Year – the classy Cavarra was ultimately named skipper.

For his part, Greene became the first Box Hill player since Mark Passador 20 years earlier to tally 50 goals in a season. He would also kick his 100th VFL goal in Round 18. Establishment figures James Parsons, Ed Phillips and Porter all celebrated their 50th VFL games, while the likes of Max Hall, Max Walton, Luis D'Angelo, Mitch Sruk, David Brinker-Ritchie, Lachlan Wynd, Mason Hawkins, Jake Arundell and Liam Coghlan made their state league debuts.

On the surface, eighth place and an Elimination Final exit isn't what Box Hill is about, but the lessons learned and platform laid throughout 2022 will hold the Club in good stead as it readies itself for the challenges ahead.

Looking forward, the new season will see a new-look Box Hill Hawks, with the club set to welcome fresh leadership in the coaches box and front office. Zane Littlejohn will take the reigns as Box Hill Senior Coach, while also serving as Development Coach for the A.F.L. Hawks. The 36-year-old bring a wealth of experience, including spending the past six years at the Brisbane Lions as both a Development Coach and Head Coach of the Lions Academy.

Before then it is important to acknowledge the contributions of the departing Clint Proctor, Andy Otten and Daniel Napoli, who each contributed tellingly to what the Club is and will continue to be – because good people who will always be the foundation of our success.

V.F.L.W. Report

Season 2022 was an exciting one for Hawthorn's V.F.L.W. team, with unprecedented success following a disappointing 2021 finish. Winning twelve out of their fourteen games for the home and away season, Hawthorn only suffered one loss and a draw to complete their almost perfect home-and-away campaign.

Under new V.F.L.W. Senior Coach Cherie O'Neill, Hawthorn proved itself to be a powerhouse at producing A.F.L.W. talent, with seventeen players drafted this season. Nine of those players have remained at Hawthorn, including V.F.L.W. Captain, and now A.F.L.W. Vice-Captain, Tamara Luke. Despite losing these players to A.F.L.W. programs, the Hawks still managed to qualify for Finals and ultimately finished second on the ladder.

Sadly, the team couldn't defeat their old rivals Essendon at Windy Hill in the Qualifying Final before losing to the Saints at Box Hill in the Semi-Final. These losses were the only misstep in an incredible season that defied all odds.

Over 50 players donned the brown and gold jersey this season, signalling Hawthorn's commitment to championing women's pathways through football. From 17-year-old Sky Wilson, who debuted in Round 13, to Hawthorn legend Meg Hutchins who has played over 250 games in her career – Cherie O'Neill worked closely with her all-female coaching panel to guide the team through a constantly changing roster of talent.

At the Best and Fairest night, star midfielder Jordan Mifsud was crowned the 2022 Champion following a stellar season. In her debut season as a V.F.L.W. Hawk, Mifsud averaged 15.7 disposals and 4.9 tackles, and played every game. Mifsud became the first Indigenous woman (Peek Whurrong, Gunditjmarra) to win the club's V.F.L.W. Best and Fairest.

Kristy Stratton and Jessie Williams shared the award for Leading Goalkicker, and defender Ellie McLinden was named Most Promising Player. Jade Wise won the Best Club Person award.

It took an army of coaches, support staff and volunteers to push Hawthorn's V.F.L.W. team achingly close to a Grand Final in 2022. That army will be back in season 2023, ready to help the V.F.L.W. Hawks soar again.

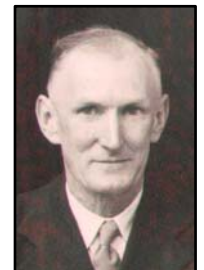
